

Pharmacy Contraception Service Hints & Tips

Always ensure your staff are trained on these key services and that they are actively promoting them to patients in a friendly and helpful manner. Building good relationships with patients is essential to the success of your pharmacy's offerings.

Booking patients in for next time when they receive their prescription

On handout of an eligible prescription, encourage patients to book an appointment for the contraception service when they're next due. This is a great opportunity to lock-in the patient and prevent them from forgetting about the service months down the line.

Drug Reports to contact patients for booking

Utilise your PMR drug reports to identify patients who may be eligible for the service. Proactively contact these patients to offer booking opportunities.

Use stickers for key messages on prescriptions

Stickers can be an effective way to convey important messages and to remind staff to promote the service. Use them on prescription bags, medication bottles, or even on shelves to highlight services or to remind patients of consultations.

Use bag stuffers / information leaflets effectively

Include a leaflet when dispensing a prescription for a contraceptive. This informs the patient about the service and will help to increase the numbers of patients coming to the pharmacy for it.

Promote your booking system for the service

Advertise your booking system for the service through posters, social media, or even verbally when they're picking up prescription and include links to your booking site. Simplified booking will help improve patient attendance and scheduling.

Schedule text reminders for appointments

Set up automated text reminders for patients who've booked appointments. Reminding them 24-48 hours in advance helps reduce no-shows, ensuring your schedule stays full and efficient.

Collaborate with your local GPs to promote services. Share information about available pharmacy services so they can refer patients to you, improving community health outcomes.
